Advice on images

Too many Drawing Inspiration Award applications are let down by poor photographs. It is important that the images accompanying your application are carefully edited to tell the story of your event and represent both activities and results. Approximately 20 images should be enough for this purpose. Here is a list of common mistakes:

1. Just pictures of the final work
2. Just pictures of people engaged in activity
3. Too many images of similar things
4. The same image taken from multiple angles or at different zooms
5. Too few images
6. Focusing on something in the description that is not accompanied by an image
7. Unedited/uncropped images
8. Images which have not been rotated correctly
9. Photos of small children doing nothing!
